ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE TOWN BOARD

AND TOWN OFFICERS AND OFFICIALS FROM ISSUING
LICENSES, PERMITS AND THE LIKE TO PERSONS,
FIRMS, CORPORATIONS OR FOR THE BENEFIT OF PROPERTY
IN THE TOWN UPON WHICH DEBTS OR OBLIGATIONS ARE
OWED TO THE TOWN

The Town Board of the Town of Kildare, Juneau County, 'isconsin, in order to promote the public health, safety, general 'elfare and good order of the Town of Kildare, and for its inhabitants, pursuant to its police powers inherent to it as a 'own and granted to it by the electors of the Town pursuant to the provisions of Section 60.10(2)(c) and Section 60.22 (3), does ordain as follows:

Section 1

Neither the Town Board nor any officer, official or agent thereof shall issue any license or permit or take any final affirmative action for the benefit of any person, firm, corporation or lands within the Town to be benefited thereby where there is an indebtedness owed to the Town by any such person, firm or corporation or for any land which will be benefited thereby.

Section 2

Any such permit, license or the like issued in violation of Section 1 shall be void.

Section 3

Should any section, clause or provision of this Ordinance be declared by the Court to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 4

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.
